# **BUSHFIRE RECOVERY**

# Bushfire Recovery Grants for Community Facilities

The Bushfire Recovery Grants for Community Facilities (up to \$50,000) will support community groups who want help to build, upgrade or repair important local facilities that everyone can use.

Examples of projects that could be funded through the community facilities grants include upgrades to kitchens or bathrooms at local halls, repairs to fix damage, or new facilities such as playgrounds, community gardens and small pavilions.

#### Small Business Bushfire Support Program

The Victorian and Commonwealth Governments provide Small Business Bushfire Support Grants of up to \$10,000 to support small businesses who have experienced a significant loss of income due to the Victorian bushfires that commenced 21 November 2019.

These grants are available to small businesses in the local council areas of Alpine, East Gippsland, Indigo, Mansfield, Towong, Wellington and the Rural City of Wangaratta.





Grant assistance is also available to small businesses who work within the eligible disaster areas on a regular basis, provided they can demonstrate significant impact.

# Legal assistance for people engaging with the Royal Commission into National Natural Disaster Arrangements

The Royal Commission into National Natural Disaster Arrangements has been established to inquire and make recommendations on government coordination of, response to and arrangements for dealing with national natural disasters.

Legal financial assistance may be provided to an entity, including an individual, for their reasonable legal representation and disbursement costs.

# Wildlife and Habitat Bushfire Recovery Program – Tranche 2

The Wildlife and Habitat Bushfire Recovery Program will provide funding to support the immediate survival and long-term recovery and resilience for fire-affected Australian animals, plants, ecological communities and other natural assets and their cultural values for Indigenous Australians.

Up to \$12 million grants is available under the Program, with grants of between \$100,000 and \$1 million being offered.

# Environment Restoration Fund: Wildlife Rescue and Rehabilitation

The purpose of the program is to provide funding of \$5,000 - \$1,000,000 to support wildlife rehabilitators (including community wildlife carer Edition July 2020

organisations, veterinarians, animal hospitals, zoos, local shelter operators and foster carers) to rescue, treat and rehabilitate wildlife impacted by bushfires and return them into suitable natural environments or otherwise take care of them.

It will also support actions to preserve at-risk populations of threatened species impacted by destruction of their habitat through bushfire.

#### **Emergency Bushfire Primary Industries Grants**

Grants of up to \$75,000 are now available to eligible primary producers impacted by the Victorian Bushfires commencing 21 November 2019.

The support is available to bushfire affected primary producers in the local government areas of Ararat, Alpine, Ballarat, East Gippsland, Glenelg, Golden Plains, Greater Bendigo, Indigo, Mansfield, Moyne, Northern Grampians, Pyrenees, Southern Grampians, Strathbogie, Towong, Wangaratta, Wellington and Wodonga, and the alpine areas of Falls Creek, Mount Buller, Mount Hotham and Mount Stirling.

Grants may be used to cover the costs associated with clean up and reinstatement of the entity, as detailed in the guidelines.

## **Red Cross Bushfire Recovery grants**

The following grants have been increased:

Primary Residence Repair Grant – amount increased from \$5,000 to \$10,000

Re-establishment Grant – amount increased for home owner occupiers up to \$40,000





Injury grant – a further \$7500 available for those who have additional out of pocket medical expenses (making \$15,000 total available)

Bereavement grant – An additional \$30,000 available for the senior next of kin if they are continuing to experience financial hardship.

# The Creative Recovery Small Grants Program

The Creative Recovery Small Grants Program supports community connection, engagement and resilience for communities impacted by the 2019-20 bushfires in regional Victoria. The program will focus on the creative activity that assists these communities with short and long term recovery.

The program will support individual artists and organisations based in six local government authority areas of Alpine, East Gippsland, Indigo, Mansfield, Towong and Wangaratta.

Up to \$5000 is available for individuals and organisations. In limited circumstances, applicants may be invited to apply for funding above this threshold after consulting with Regional Arts Victoria.

# The Regional Connectivity Program (RCP)

The Regional Connectivity Program (RCP) is a \$53 million competitive grant opportunity to expand the economic, social and public safety benefits of improved digital connectivity to regional, rural and remote Australian communities. Funded infrastructure under the RCP must provide retail mobile or broadband services to a regional, rural or remote community or a subset of the community (such as local businesses, tourist locations, schools etc). Proposals must demonstrate the clear need for improved telecommunications and community support for any proposed economic and/or social benefits.

# **Energy Efficient Communities Program**

Dairy Farming Business Grants provides dairy farming businesses with grants of up to \$20,000 to improve energy efficiency, reduce energy costs and lower on-farm emissions. Grants may be used for equipment replacement, component upgrades, energy audits or feasibility studies.

# **Aged Care Workforce Retention**

The purpose of the grant opportunity is to provide eligible aged care providers and agencies with funding to make retention bonus payments to Eligible Aged Care Workers in the residential aged care and Home Care Packages Program.

For residential aged care workers, this includes registered nurses, enrolled nurses and personal care workers who are directly in contact with the resident to assist with dressing, showering, wound management, medication, movement, feeding, hygiene and grooming or similar direct care activities.

# **VETERANS AFFAIRS**

# Saluting Their Service Commemorative Grants Program

The program aims to preserve Australia's wartime heritage; involve people around the nation in a wide range of projects and activities that highlight the service and sacrifice of Australia's service personnel in wars, conflicts and peace operations; and promote appreciation and understanding of the experiences of service and the roles that those who served have played in shaping the nation.

There are two categories of grants available under the program:

• Community Grants (STS-CG)

Grants to a maximum of \$10,000 are available for local, community-based projects and activities.

Major Grants (STS-MG)

Grants between \$10,001 and \$150,000 are available for major commemorative projects and activities that are significant from a national, state, territory and/or regional perspective.

This program support local war memorials in Victoria that commemorate Victorians who served in wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations.

# Wine Tourism and Cellar Door Grants

The objective of the Wine Tourism and Cellar Door Grant is to support wine or cider producers who add value by attracting visitors to wine regions, and thereby encourage wine tourism.

Wine producers who have met the eligibility criteria in the preceding financial year will be able to access an annual grant of up to \$100,000 (GST exclusive) for their eligible rebatable domestic cellar door sales.

# Victorian Live Music Venues Program

The Victorian Live Music Venues Program seeks to support Victoria's live music sector by helping music venues respond to the devastating effects of the coronavirus pandemic.

Funding of up to \$130,000 can support immediate business costs caused by the shutdowns and help businesses reopen in a COVID-safe way, providing employment opportunities for music industry workers ranging from musicians and crew to bookers, promoters and more.

#### **Screen Industry Location Incentive**

The objective of the Location Incentive is to ensure that Australia remains competitive in attracting large budget international film and television productions, thereby providing opportunities for Australian cast, crew, post-production companies and other screen production service providers to participate in production.

The Location Incentive will provide funding of \$540 million over eight years from 2019-20. Grants will be provided to large budget international screen productions undertaking filming in Australia that perform strongly against the assessment criteria.

# **REGIONAL ARTS FUND – Quick Response Grants**

RAF Quick Response Grants – up to \$2,000 for Individuals, \$4,000 for organisations

Quick Response Grants are intended to assist regional artists, arts organisations and communities to take up professional or skills development or small project opportunities.

This program has been set up to be responsive to projects that fall outside the scope of other funding opportunities. Applicants must clearly explain why there is no other suitable funding program for their project.

The Quick Response Grant program is open to applications on an ongoing basis by financial quarter. There will be up to four allocations per year. They will be open on an ongoing basis.

All Quick Response Grants must be completed by 1 January 2022. Project start date must be at least 30 business days from submission date.

Environment Restoration Fund: Wildlife Rescue and Rehabilitation.

The purpose of the program is to provide funding of between \$5,000 - \$1 million to support wildlife rehabilitators (including community wildlife carer organisations, veterinarians, animal hospitals, zoos, local shelter operators and foster carers) to rescue, treat and rehabilitate wildlife impacted by bushfires and return them into suitable natural environments or otherwise take care of them. It will also support actions to preserve at-risk populations of threatened species impacted by destruction of their habitat through bushfire. The investment will also build organisational and carer capacity and preparedness to respond to future emergencies.
